Woodturning Competition Rules 2015

COMPETITION IS OPEN TO ANY CURRENT WGO MEMBER

- Entries may NOT have been entered in any previous WGO competition.
- Entries may be made up of multiple pieces. Multiple piece entries MUST have a method of showing that the entry is made up of multiple pieces. e.g. a 'pad' or a display platform.
- Any lighting or motion display platform must be self powered, power cords are NOT allowed.
- Display platforms MUST NOT be taller than any single entry piece.
- ANY entry (except youth) which, in the opinion of the judge(s) is too advanced for the level entered, may be moved to a higher level before judging takes place.

MASTERS (LEVEL V): There is only one 'open' category for this skill level.

For professional turners and any member who wishes to participate at the highest level.

Each member may submit a maximum of five (5) entries in this level.

OPEN (LEVEL IV): Open to all members who wish to participate at this level.

Members winning two (2) 1st or four (4) 2nd or 3rd place ribbons at the Intermediate level must compete in "Open".

Four categories; Bowl/Platter/Hollow-form

Boxes Pens Other

Each member may submit a maximum of (5) entries total.

INTERMEDIATE (LEVEL III):

Three categories; Bowl/Platter/Hollow-form

Pens Other

Members winning two (2) 1st or four (4) 2nd or 3rd place ribbons at the Novice level must compete in "Intermediate".

Each member may submit a maximum of two (2) entries in each category (total 6 maximum).

NOVICE (LEVEL II):

Three categories; Bowl/Platter/Hollow-form

Pens Other

Each member may submit a maximum of two (2) entries in each category (total 6 maximum).

YOUTH (LEVEL I): There is only one 'open' category for this skill level

Open to any young member under the age of 18 years.

Each member may submit a maximum of five (5) entries in this level.

CATEGORY DESCRIPTIONS

Bowl / Platter: Any turning which resembles, or may be used as a bowl or platter

Hollow-form: Any turned object where the opening of the vessel is 'small' relative to the outside dimensions.

Pen: Any piece which is a writing instrument.

Box: Any turning whose function is a lidded container.

Other: Any turning which, by design and/or construction, is unique and which does not

fit into any of the above categories. Spindle turnings are included in this category.



WOODTURNING COMPETITION JUDGING CRITERIA

Judging will be based on:

- Concept: Artistry, Originality, Creativity
- Execution: Successful execution of idea, Craftsmanship, Finish
- Technical difficulty: Size, Texture(s), Carving, Laminations, contours
- Use of Materials: Appropriateness of material for execution of project
- Form, Design, Balance: How the piece makes one feel, what does it feel like.
- Overall Impression: How pleasing, both visual and tactile

Best of Category judging:

- Each category within each skill level is considered as a competition by itself.
- A category should have a minimum of four (4) entries. Failing this, that category may still be judged, but any one or all prizes may or may not be awarded.
- A category with less than four (4) entries may be combined with another category in the same skill level. This decision will be at the judge's and organizer's discretion.

Best of Skill Level judging:

- Each skill level is considered as a competition by itself.
- Within the same skill level, all 1st place winners of each category are eligible.

Best of Competition judging:

- All entries are eligible.
- Judging may be done by one of the following methods;
 - Decision by judge(s) selected for the competition.
 - Selection by all attendees in a secret ballot.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Any signature or personal identification on entries must be covered prior to judging.

The judges will award prizes only to deserving work. This means that if, in the judges opinion, there are no entries worthy of any or all prizes – any one or all of these prizes may be withheld.
